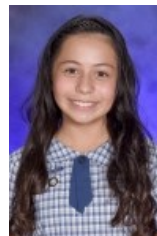

## State Athletics Carnival

Last Wednesday and Thursday the South Coast Athletics Team attended the State Athletics Carnival at the Sydney Olympic Park Athletics Centre.

Off to an early start, Olivia placed 5<sup>th</sup> in the 1500m timed finals for an invitational event that only takes place every 4 years. Tyler and Neeve then joined in on the action for the 100m sprints. Up against some very stiff competition, they managed to keep their nerves under control to finish strong. Tyler finished 37<sup>th</sup> overall and Neeve 21<sup>st</sup>. After a lengthy rest Olivia fired up again in the 800m heats. She finished strong with a PB placing 2<sup>nd</sup> in her heat qualifying 8<sup>th</sup> fastest for the finals. Ella also raced in the Junior 800m for her first experience at State and placed 31<sup>st</sup> overall.

Day 2 of the action saw Madison take to the field for shot put. Madison finished 34<sup>th</sup> overall against some very strong girls. Olivia then hit the track for the 800m finals, gaining a few places and finishing 5<sup>th</sup> overall, a massive achievement. Finally, the Senior Girls Relay pulled together to win their heat convincingly. After a short break, they again hit the track to take place in the semis. The girls placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in their semi, heading into the finals with the 5<sup>th</sup> fastest time. With some tired but exhausted legs, Lisa, Rachael, Olivia and Neeve put their training into action one last time and pounded the track placing 7<sup>th</sup> in the Senior Girls Relay State final.

Overall, a very competitive, successful and happy team for UPS and the South Coast teams in 2017. Many thanks to the teachers, coaches and parents for their ongoing support. It takes a small army of dedicated students, teachers and parents to reach these levels of success.
