Dear Parents and Students,

Congratulations to Riley B. who has been selected to play in the PSSA golf tournament in Camden in September, representing the South Coast. Well done Riley and good luck!

What a great achievement. We have so many talented students at this school in a range of disciplines. It is great to see they are able to pursue their dreams. Thanks has to go to the parents who give up their time and money to provide their children with the opportunity to participate and who also take them to the events. I know it is not easy.

Eight staff will be absent tomorrow as they are travelling to Sydney to visit a school to observe what they have in place to improve student outcomes in both literacy and numeracy. As a result, staff will expand their knowledge base and use this expertise to further develop and implement literacy and numeracy programs at Ulladulla Public School.

As you know our focus is on ensuring continuity of practice throughout the school. Staff here work hard but we want to ensure that the data collected for every child shows a years growth for a years work. This does not mean every child will get there. Their progress will depend on their attendance at school, how can you learn if you are not here? Students need to take responsibility for their participation in class and do the best they can at all times. It also means staff need to be providing learning that differentiates for all students within the class. This is all about meeting the professional standards I have written about before. Schools are to become much more accountable for what they do, how they do it and what results come from their efforts.

Not all children improve at the same rate, some students have learning difficulties or a diagnosis that requires additional support, but as teachers it is our responsibility to work with parents and students to support them so they can also achieve high standards.

The school has established their own internal website, thanks to Mr Burns, for sharing of professional readings, programs, the school plan and teaching strategies. This is expanding every week and we will then all be able to access the same information and utilise the programs K-6 that cover all outcomes and are sequentially planned to ensure best practice.

We also have a focus on data and how and why we test children. What does the testing tell us? How does it change classroom practice to ensure students needs are being met? These are all areas we are working on to ensure maximum academic growth is achieved.

The school has registered for 'Earn and Learn' with Woolworths. We are not asking parents to change their shopping habits but if you do shop at Woolworths, please collect the Earn and Learn stickers and drop them in the box at Woolworths or send them to school as we also have a box for collection in the office. In the past the school has been able to acquire sporting equipment as well as classroom resources from this program

South Coast Golf Trials

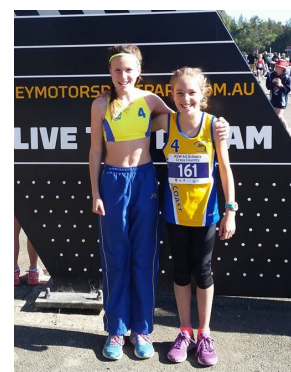

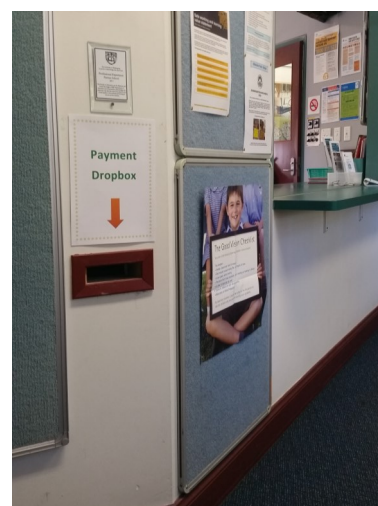
State Cross Country Representatives
