Staff Development Days	The first day of Term 1, 2 and 3 and the last two days of Term 4 are staff development days. These days allow staff to prepare teaching programs and participate in professional development.

#### School Information



Absences Parents/carers are required by law to ensure their children attend school. All absences need to be explained by a note for nonattendance, ideally upon the students return from absence. Absences of three consecutive days may require a medical certificate. Planned Absences over five days require an Extended Leave application which needs to be approved by the Principal before the leave is taken.

Canteen The school canteen is open Monday to Friday and is run by the P & C under the guidance of a canteen committee. Children may buy from the canteen between the following times: 9am - 9:25am, 11:25am - 11:50am and 1:25pm - 2:10pm. Lunch orders are to be placed in class baskets at the beginning of the day.

- Early Leavers and Late<br/>ArrivalsParents/carers need to report to the front office with their<br/>child/children to obtain a late arrival slip if arriving after 9:25am.<br/>An early leaver slip will need to be obtained from the front office<br/>before parents/carers are able to collect their child/children from<br/>class prior to 3:30pm.
  - **Excursions** Students have the opportunity to attend excursions throughout the year. Excursion notes will be given to eligible students with details of the planned excursion and will require a Parent/Carer to provide their signature giving their child/children permission to attend.

Some excursions may include a cost which will have a cut off date for payment that needs to be adhered to. It is encouraged that payment be made through our Parent Online Payment system which is accessible through our school website. Cash or cheque payments should be deposited through the Payment Dropbox located in the front office. Please make cheques payable to NSW Government Schools.

Merit System Each day students are encouraged to be safe, responsible and respectful and are regularly given verbal feedback on their behaviour. Additionally, Ulladulla Public School rewards its students through a merit system, the first being class level awards which includes four categories; Citizenship, Academic, Effort, and Sport. School level Awards are given when a student collects ten class level awards of the same category. There are an additional three award categories available at school level; Attendance, Quiet Achiever and Gifted & Talented. When students accumulate five school level awards (must include three categories) they will receive a Silver Principal's Award. The highest award, the Gold Principal's Award, is awarded when a student accumulates three Silver Principal's Awards.

	Every week the school newsletter is published on a Monday. The newsletter is full of information regarding what is happening at school and is uploaded to our website and Facebook page.
School Uniform	The NSW Department of Education encourages school uniforms to be worn as they not only foster pride in the school, they also provide identification within the community and during excursions, increasing student safety. Ulladulla Public School Uniform includes a sky blue polo with school logo, grey shorts for boys and blue checked shorts for girls. There is also a blue checked dress available for girls.

	School uniforms are available from Rapt Bratz in Ulladulla or online through Milton Ulladulla School Uniforms. The P & C have an online store, and also operate a second hand uniform store every Tuesday and Friday morning between 9 - 10am on school grounds. School hats are sold through canteen. 	In order for our staff to provide appropriate duty of care for your child/children please notify the school in writing of any changes to any of the following; address, contact numbers, custody/court orders, medical/doctor details, general permissions (including photo publishing permission, scripture preference, etc.)
Student Medication	If your child requires long term medication to be administered at school you will need to complete an Individual Health Care Plan. Interim medication, such as prescribed antibiotics, require a Permission to Administer Medication form to be completed before medication can be given. Students are not permitted to carry any type of medication in their school bag unless they have been given permission by the Principal to do so. Please note: All medication needs to clearly show prescription details. No over the counter medication can be administered by office staff. Other forms may be required for certain medical conditions.
Problem Solving	If you have a problem that you would like to discuss, your first point of contact should always be your child's classroom teacher. If you are not able to get a resolution, the next step would be to talk to the Assistant Principal of the relevant stage. Lastly, if these options have not been successful, the issue would then progress to our senior executive.

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Travelling to School	<ul> <li>Bus travel</li> <li>Students in Kindergarten through to Year 2 are entitled to free bus travel. Students in Year 3 through Year 6 are only eligible for free bus travel if they live outside a 1.6km radius from the school. All students entering Year 3 will need to apply for a bus pass online at transportnsw.info/school-students</li> <li>Bus Route enquiries:</li> <li>Ulladulla Bus Lines - 4455 1674</li> <li>Kellams Bus Lines - 4455 1674</li> <li>All students travelling to and from school on buses should follow instructions given by their bus driver. Inappropriate behaviour may result in loss of bus pass.</li> <li>Private car</li> <li>Parents/Carers are asked to observe all traffic rules associated with school zones and note that there is no parking available in school grounds. There is a drop-off zone at the front of the school.</li> <li>Riding to school</li> <li>Pupils in Years 5 &amp; 6 are permitted to ride to school, provided that the bike they are riding is in a road-safe condition, a bike helmet is worn and the bike is wheeled inside school grounds. Bike racks are located to the rear of the Administration block.</li> <li>Walking to school are asked to take the most direct route to school and take extra care when crossing roads, making sure to cross at marked crossings wherever possible. Ulladulla Public School has the benefit of a Crossing Superintendent to supervise the pedestrian crossing between the following times: 8:30am—9:30am and 3pm—4pm.</li> </ul>

#### Infectious Diseases Exclusion Guidelines



Disease	Time from Exposure to Illness	Symptoms	Keep child home
Chicken Pox	10 to 21 days	Slight fever, runny nose, and a rash that begins as raised pink spots that blister and scab.	Yes For 5 days from the onset of the rash, and the blisters have dried.
Conjunctivitis	1 to 3 days	Eyes feel scratchy, are red and may water. Eyelids may stick together on waking.	<b>Yes</b> While there is discharge from the eye.
Gastroenteritis	Several hours to several days.	A combination of frequent loose or watery stools, vomiting, fever, stomach cramps, headaches.	<b>Yes</b> At least for 24 hours after diarrhoea stops.
German Measles (Rubella)	14 to 21 days	Often mild or no symptoms: mild fever, runny nose, swollen nodes, pink blotchy rash that lasts a short time. Can cause birth defects if pregnant women are infected.	<b>Yes</b> At least 4 days after the rash appears.
Glandular Fever	4 to 6 weeks	Fever, headache, sore throat, tiredness, swollen nodes.	<b>No</b> Unless sick.
Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease	3 to 5 days	Mild illness, perhaps with a fever, blisters around the mouth, on the hands and feet.	Yes Until the blisters have dried.
Head Lice	Usually 7 to 10 days	Itchy scalp, white specks stuck to the base of the hairs; lice may be found on the scalp.	<b>No</b> As long as head lice management is ongoing.
Hepatitis A	From 2 to 7 weeks	Often none in small children, sudden fever, loss of appetite, nausea, vomiting, jaundice, dark urine, pale stools.	Yes 2 weeks after first symptoms, or 1 week after onset of jaundice.
Impetigo (school sores)	1 to 3 days	Small red spots change into blisters that fill up with pus and become crusted; usually on the face, hands and scalp.	Yes Until antibiotic treatment starts. Sores should be covered with watertight dressings.

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Disease	Time from Exposure	Symptoms	Keep child home

Influenza	1 to 3 days	Sudden onset fever, runny nose, sore throat, cough, muscle aches and headaches.	Yes Until they look and feel better.
Measles	10 to 12 days for first symptoms 14 days until rash develops	Fever, tiredness, runny nose, cough and sore red eyes for a few days followed by a red blotchy rash that starts on the face and spreads down the body, lasts 4 to 7 days.	<b>Yes</b> For at least 4 days after rash appears.
Meningococcal Disease	Can range from 2 to 10 days	Sudden onset of fever and a combination of headache, neck stiffness, nausea, vomiting, drowsiness or rash.	Yes Seek medical attention immediately.
Molluscum Contagiosum	7 days to 6 months	Multiple small, smooth, firm round lumps with dimples in the middle. Mostly appear on face, trunk, upper arms and legs.	<b>No</b> Note that symptoms can last up to 2 years without treatment.
Mumps	Can range from 12 to 25 days	Fever, swollen and tender glands around the jaw.	<b>Yes</b> For 9 days after onset of swelling.
Ringworm	Varies, may be several days	Small scaly patch on the skin surrounded by a pink ring.	<b>Yes</b> Until the day after fungal treatment has begun.
Scabies	New infections: 2 to 6 weeks Reinfection: 1 to 4 days	Itchy skin, worse at night. Worst around wrists, armpits, buttocks, groin and between fingers and toes.	<b>Yes</b> Until the day after treatment has begun.
Scarlet Fever	1 to 3 days	Sudden onset sore throat, high fever and vomiting, followed by a rash in 12 to 36 hours.	<b>Yes</b> until at least 24 hours of treatment has begun and child is feeling better.
Slapped Cheek	1 to 2 weeks	Mild fever, red cheeks, itchy lace- like rash, and possibly cough, sore throat or runny nose Can cause foetal disease in pregnant women.	<b>No</b> As it is most infectious before the rash appears.
Whooping Cough	Can range from 6 to 20 days	Starts with a running nose, followed by persistent cough that comes in bouts. Bouts maybe followed by vomiting and a whooping sound as the child gasps for air.	<b>Yes</b> Until the first 5 days of a special antibiotic have been taken.
